Scripture Readings

Ephesians 6:10-17 (Epistle)

Brethren, be strong in the Lord and in the power of His might. Put on the whole armor of God, that you may be able to stand against the wiles of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against principalities, against powers, against the rulers of the darkness of this age, against spiritual hosts of wickedness in the heavenly places. Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand. Stand therefore, having girded your waist with truth, having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and having shod your feet with the preparation of the gospel of peace; above all, taking the shield of faith with which you will be able to quench all the fiery darts of the wicked one. And take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God.

Luke 18:35-43 (Gospel)

At that time, as the Lord Jesus was coming near Jericho, that a certain blind man sat by the road begging. And hearing a multitude passing by, he asked what it meant. So they told him that Jesus of Nazareth was passing by. And he cried out, saying, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!" Then those who went before warned him that he should be quiet; but he cried out all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" So Jesus stood still and commanded him to be brought to Him. Leavetaking of Theophany

The Leavetaking of the Feast of Theophany takes place on January 14. The entire office of the Feast is repeated except for the Entrance, festal readings, Litya, Blessing of Loaves at Vespers, and the Polyeleos and festal Gospel at Matins. The festal Antiphons are not sung at Liturgy, and the Epistle and Gospel of the day are read.

St. Savva I, first Archbishop of Serbia

Saint Savva, born as Prince Rostislav of Serbia, felt a spiritual calling from a young age. Leaving his royal roots behind, he embraced monastic life on Mount Athos, eventually contributing to the establishment of the Serbian Hilandar monastery. His piety and leadership caught the attention of the Byzantine Church, leading to his consecration as the first Archbishop of Serbia in 1219.

Savva tirelessly organized and strengthened the Serbian Church, performing miracles, negotiating peace with Hungary, and even crowning his brother as king. He actively reformed monastic practices, established churches, and promoted Orthodoxy throughout the land. After a lifetime of service, he embarked on a final pilgrimage, visiting holy sites and collecting relics before peacefully passing away in Bulgaria in 1237.

Saint Savva's legacy lives on as a revered figure in Orthodox Christianity, his influence spanning from Serbian traditions to church canons used in Russia. His unwavering dedication and transformative journey from prince to archbishop continue to inspire generations of faithful across the Slavic nations.
