Scripture Readings

Colossians 1:12-18 (Epistle)

Brethren, giving thanks to the Father who has qualified us to be partakers of the inheritance of the saints in the light. He has delivered us from the power of darkness and conveyed us into the kingdom of the Son of His love, in whom we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of sins. He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation. For by Him all things were created that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. And He is before all things, and in Him all things consist. And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that in all things He may have the preeminence.

Matthew 22:1-14 (Gospel)

The Lord said this Parable: "The kingdom of heaven is like a certain king who arranged a marriage for his son, and sent out his servants to call those who were invited to the wedding; and they were not willing to come. Again, he sent out other servants, saying, 'Tell those who are invited, "See, I have prepared my dinner; my oxen and fatted cattle are killed, and all things are ready. Come to the wedding." But they made light of it and went their ways, one to his own farm, another to his business. And the rest seized his servants, treated them spitefully, and killed them. But when the king heard about it, he was furious. And he sent out his armies, destroyed those murderers, and burned up their city. Then he said to his servants, 'The wedding is ready, but those who were invited were not worthy. Therefore go into the highways, and as many as you find, invite to the wedding.' So those servants went out into the highways and gathered together all whom they found, both bad and good. And the wedding hall was filled with guests. But when the king came in to see the guests, he saw a man there who did not have on a wedding garment. So he said to him, 'Friend, how did you come in here without a wedding garment?' And he was speechless. Then the king said to the servants, 'Bind him hand and foot, take him away, and cast him into outer darkness; there will be weeping and gnashing of teeth.' For many are called, but few are chosen."

Venerable Maximus the Confessor

Born into a pious family in Constantinople, Saint Maximus received an elite education and pursued a successful career in government. However, his conscience led him to renounce worldly pursuits and embrace monastic life. His wisdom and humility soon earned him the respect of his brethren, and he became the abbot of the Chrysopolis monastery.

When the Monothelite heresy, denying the dual nature of Christ, began to spread, Saint Maximus emerged as a fierce defender of Orthodoxy. He tirelessly preached and debated, winning over both clergy and common folk. He even ventured to Africa and Rome to seek support from Pope Theodore, eventually leading to the Lateran Council which condemned Monothelitism.

Emperor Constans, a Monothelite himself, retaliated by imprisoning Saint Maximus and subjecting him to brutal torture. Despite the suffering, Saint Maximus remained steadfast in his faith. He died in exile, revered as a martyr and beacon of unwavering devotion to the truth.

Saint Maximus left behind a vast theological legacy. His writings covered a wide range of topics, including scriptural interpretation, dogmatic theology, and mystical experiences. He emphasized the importance of deification, where humans, through God's grace, can become partakers in His divine nature. His works, heavily influenced by both patristic traditions and ancient philosophy, laid the foundation for future theologians like Symeon the New Theologian and Gregory Palamas.

Saint Maximus' life and teachings offer a powerful example of unwavering faith and intellectual courage. He teaches us to stand up for truth, even in the face of persecution, and to seek a deeper understanding of God through both reason and mystical experience. His legacy continues to inspire theologians, scholars, and ordinary believers alike, reminding us that the pursuit of truth and communion with God is a lifelong journey worth undertaking.
