Scripture Readings

Colossians 3:4-11 (Epistle)

Brethren, when Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory. Therefore put to death your members which are on the earth: fornication, uncleanness, passion, evil desire, and covetousness, which is idolatry. Because of these things the wrath of God is coming upon the sons of disobedience, in which you yourselves once walked when you lived in them. But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him, where there is neither Greek nor Jew, circumcised nor uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave nor free, but Christ is all and in all.

Matthew 22:35-46 (Gospel)

At that time, one of them, a lawyer, asked Him a question, testing Him, and saying, "Teacher, which is the great commandment in the law?" Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments hang all the Law and the Prophets." While the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus asked them, saying, "What do you think about the Christ? Whose Son is He?" They said to Him, "The Son of David." He said to them, "How then does David in the Spirit call Him 'Lord,' saying: 'The LORD said to my Lord, sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool'? If David then calls Him 'Lord,' how is He his Son?" And no one was able to answer Him a word, nor from that day on did anyone dare question Him anymore.

Venerable Ephraim the Syrian

Born into a humble family, Saint Ephraim began his life with a fiery temper and doubts about faith. However, a pivotal dream and imprisonment led him to embrace repentance and seek guidance from Saint James of Nisibis. Under his mentorship, Ephraim transformed into a dedicated monk, preaching, teaching, and even accompanying him to the Council of Nicaea.

After relocating to Edessa, Saint Ephraim's wisdom and eloquence shone through. He wrote extensively, including the first Syriac commentary on the Pentateuch and numerous prayers and hymns still cherished today. He fervently defended orthodoxy against Arianism and inspired pagans to convert.

Despite his accomplishments, Saint Ephraim remained grounded in humility. He declined offers of priesthood and bishopric, even feigning madness to avoid the latter. He dedicated his final years to alleviating the suffering of Edessa's inhabitants during a famine, establishing a poorhouse for the needy.

In essence, Saint Ephraim's journey exemplifies the transformative power of faith and the importance of selflessness in serving God and community.
