Scripture Readings

Hebrews 11:33-12:2 (Epistle)

Brethren, through faith subdued kingdoms, worked righteousness, obtained promises, stopped the mouths of lions, quenched the violence of fire, escaped the edge of the sword, out of weakness were made strong, became valiant in battle, turned to flight the armies of the aliens. Women received their dead raised to life again. Others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might obtain a better resurrection. Still others had trial of mockings and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented - of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth. And all these, having obtained a good testimony through faith, did not receive the promise, God having provided something better for us, that they should not be made perfect apart from us. Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God.

Matthew 10:32-33, 37-38, 19:27-30 (Gospel)

The Lord Said: Therefore whoever confesses Me before men, him I will also confess before My Father who is in heaven. But whoever denies Me before men, him I will also deny before My Father who is in heaven. He who loves father or mother more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who loves son or daughter more than Me is not worthy of Me. And he who does not take his cross and follow after Me is not worthy of Me. Then Peter answered and said to Him, "See, we have left all and followed You. Therefore what shall we have?" So Jesus said to them, "Assuredly I say to you, that in the regeneration, when the Son of Man sits on the throne of His glory, you who have followed Me will also sit on twelve thrones, judging the twelve tribes of Israel. And everyone who has left houses or brothers or sisters or father or mother or wife or children or lands, for My name's sake, shall receive a hundredfold, and inherit eternal life. But many who are first will be last, and the last first.

Synaxis of All Saints

The Sunday following Pentecost is dedicated to honoring All Saints, both known and unknown. Saints have existed throughout history and across the world, including Apostles, Martyrs, Prophets, Hierarchs, Monastics, and the Righteous, all perfected by the Holy Spirit. This celebration acknowledges the saints' fulfillment of God's directive to "be holy, for I am holy," and it is fitting to commemorate All Saints on the first Sunday after Pentecost.

The feast may have originated as a celebration of all martyrs and was later expanded to include all individuals who bore witness to Christ through virtuous lives. Saint Peter of Damascus and Saint ikdmos of the Holy Mountain categorized saints into Apostles, Martyrs, Prophets, Hierarchs, Monastics, and the Righteous. Hymnology for the feast lists these categories, and some saints are also recognized as Confessors, who boldly confessed Christ and faced persecution without being martyred.

The order of the six types of saints—Apostles, Martyrs, Prophets, Hierarchs, Monastics, and the Righteous—reflects their importance to the Church. Apostles, who spread the Gospel first, are followed by Martyrs for their courage. Prophets, who foretold Christ's coming, are listed next, succeeded by Hierarchs, Monastics, and the Righteous who achieved holiness in the world. The feast Departed: gained prominence in the ninth century under Emperor Leo VI, who dedicated the Sunday after Pentecost to All Saints, partly in honor of his pious wife, Empress Theophano.
